LU-10378: "lfs find" is missing "--printf" support

- Would be useful if `lfs find` had a `-ls` option
- Even better, add a `--printf` option and have the `-ls` option be implemented as a fixed format of `--printf`
- For info that is not Lustre-specific, try to use the same `%` format directives as `find`
- For Lustre-specific info, create new directives prefixed with `%L` (ex - `%Lc` for stripe count)

Search Options

- `lfs find` search uses many of the same options as `find`
 - `atime/mtime/ctime`
 - `UID/GID`
 - File size and type
 - Etc.
- Also includes a lot of Lustre-specific search options
 - Component count
 - Mirror state
 - Stripe size/count
 - OST index
 - And many more

Supported Actions

- `find`
 - exec
 - execdir
 - ok
 - ls
 - print
 - printf
 - print0
 - fls
 - fprint
 - fprintf
 - fprint0
- `lfs find`
 - print
 - print0

Format Options

- The new `--printf` option for `lfs find` is intended to support several of the same `'\'` escapes and `'%'` directives as `find`

<code>\n</code>	Newline
<code>\t</code>	Horizontal tab
<code>\\</code>	Literal backslash
<code>%%</code>	Literal percent sign
<code>%a, %c, %t, %w</code>	Timestamps in ctime format
<code>%A@, %C@, %T@, %W@</code>	Timestamps in seconds since epoch

<code>%b</code>	Disk space used (in 512-byte blocks)
<code>%G</code>	Numeric group ID
<code>%m</code>	File permission bits (octal)
<code>%p</code>	File's name
<code>%s</code>	File size (bytes)
<code>%U</code>	Numeric User ID
<code>%y</code>	File's type

Note: `%w` and `%W@` (file birth times) are not standard with `find`

Lustre-specific format options for `--printf`

- New ‘%’ directives were added to print Lustre-specific details

%Lc	File's stripe count
%LF	File Identifier (FID) associated with file
%Lh	Directory's hash type
%Li	File's starting OST index (or starting MDT index for directory)

%Lo	List of all OST/MDT indices associated with file or directory
%Lp	File's OST pool
%LP	Numeric project ID
%LS	File's stripe size

Note: For composite files, the %Lc, %Li, %Lp, and %LS directives will use info from the last instantiated component.

Examples

```
#> lfs setstripe -E 10M -c 2 -S 1M -E eof -c 8 -S 4M data.txt
#> dd if=/dev/urandom of=data.txt bs=1M count=100
#> lfs find . -type f --printf "path = %p\n stripe_cnt = %Lc\n stripe_size = %LS\n start_idx = %Li\n %Lo\n"
```

```
path = ./data.txt
stripe_cnt = 8
stripe_size = 4194304
start_idx = 4
[9,0][4,3,1,7,10,8,6,12]
```

```
#> lfs find . -type f -size +100G --printf "%p (%Lc)\n"
./file4 (16)
./file1 (1)
```

```
#> lfs find . -type f -size -20M --printf "%p (%Lc)\n"
./file5 (16)
./file2 (2)
```

Search for improperly striped files.

Code Changes

- A few changes are added to `lustre/utlis/lfs.c` for processing the new `--printf` option
- In `lustre/include/lustre/lustreapi.h`, a couple of new fields are added to `struct find_param`
- Most changes are in `lustre/utlis/liblustreapi.c`
 - Vast majority of the new code deals with parsing the printf string and formatting the output
 - Some changes were made to the `cb_find_init()` function to alter the flow of how file metadata was gathered because...

metadata needed for searching != metadata needed for printing

Code Changes (cont.)

Before:

```
if (param->fp_check_projid) {  
    fd = open(path, O_RDONLY);  
    ret = fget_projid(fd, &projid);  
    if (projid != param->fp_projid) {  
        goto decided;  
    }  
}
```

} Only retrieve the project ID
if we need that info for the
search criteria

After:

```
if (param->fp_check_projid || gather_all) {  
    ...  
}
```

If --printf option is given, set the
gather_all flag and force collection
of information

Warnings and Caveats

- `lfs find` will not work on non-Lustre files if `--printf` option is used
- Can be additional load on the MDS servers if `--printf` is used and all files are matched
 - Ex: `lfs find /lustre --printf "%p %s %Lc\n"`
- Recently discovered odd behavior with some edge cases
 - Mostly related to `%Lo` with non-instantiated components
- Good News: without the `--printf` option, original code paths should remain unchanged

Future Work / Improvements

- Other potential format directives
 - %u / %g for user / group name
 - Print component flags for composite files
- Improve efficiency of printf string parsing/formatting
 - Currently reparses string on every matched file
 - Perform single pass and tokenize the string for reuse
- Be more selective in gathering metadata
 - Choose what to collect based on directives in printf string
- Add/improve test cases in sanity script
